The Great Lakes Maritime Institute is launching a fund raising campaign with one of the goals being to recover the anchor of the S.S. GREATER DETROIT. This palatial 530 foot side-wheeled steamer, designed by Frank Kirby, was the flagship of the Detroit & Cleveland Navigation Company's fleet from 1924 to 1950. On December 12, 1956 after lying dormant on the Detroit riverfront, the anchor was cut loose and the vessel towed into Lake St. Clair where it was burned as a spectacle. The GLMI plans to 'Raise the Anchor' from the Detroit River and place this iconic 6,000 pound artifact in front of the Detroit/Wayne County Port Authority Building.
