



Although the Museum will be closed during the day due to the Veterans Day Holiday, we will open Friday Evening from 5pm-9pm for the

25th Anniversary of the Loss of the EDMUND FITZGERALD. Advance tickets are \$20 for this special event and include the "Special Station Bill" (instructions in the event of an emergency), as a commemorative autographed by Captain Don Erickson. It was the WILLIAM CLAY FORD who went back out into the gale to search for the Fitz that evening. Captain Erickson will return to his actual pilot house (now a part of the Dossin Museum) and recall for us that fateful evening as part of a special presentation. A Live Feed via the new Wide Screen Projection System will make viewing the Pilot House comfortably available from DeRoy Hall.


